# 2018 Blues Showdown

This year's Battle of the Bands and Solo/Duo Competition have combined into a twofer of outstanding musical performances: the 2018 Blues Showdown on Saturday, Sept. 15!

Winners of each contest represent DCBS at the 2019 International Blues Challenge (IBC) in Memphis, TN. The IBC is the nation's biggest and most respected showcase for Blues musicians ready to

Two duos have signed to compete in the Solo/Duo Competition: Matt Kelly and Ian Walters, and Paul the Resonator and Vince Fireball Farabaugh. Five bands have set their sights on winning the prize at the Battle of the Bands: Glen Flowers and the Strangers; Carly Harvey; New Blue Soul; The Ron Hicks Project; and What Brave Soul. The bios of each band and their performance times appear on pages 4 and 5.

take their acts to national and international stages.

Each act performs a 30-minute set, with 10 minutes between sets. Doors open at 5:30 pm, and the music run from at 6–11 pm. Admission for DCBS members is \$12 in advance and \$15 at the door; admission for non-DCBS members is \$15 in advance, \$18 at the door. The Blues Showcase is held at the American Legion Cissel Saxon Post 41, 905 Sligo Ave., Silver Spring, MD 20910. Additional details are on page 3.

DCBS is fortunate to have seven "Ultimate Blues Enthusiasts" agree to serve as judges for the Blues Showdown: Alan Bowser, Amy Brady, Dick Culp, Elliott Gross, Robbin Kapsalis, Steve Levine and Miles Spicer. They will determine the outcome of both the Solo/Duo Competition and the Battle of the Bands, using a scoring system and criteria similar to the system that is used at the IBC.

Each entrant is judged on: Blues Content (weight of 4); Vocals (weight of 2); Talent (i.e., instrumental skills, weight of 2); Originality (weight of 3), and Stage Presence (weight of 2). For each criterion, judges assign a score for each band based on a scale of 1-10, with 1 being typical of a clearly beginning blues band, and 10 typical of those who play the main stage at major festivals. In addition, bands are penalized for each 10 seconds they run overtime and may be penalized for excessive time loading-in and out.

If you haven't bought your ticket for the Blues Showdown yet, do it today! The event is typically standing room only; see you at the Showdown!

# **Victor Wainwright & The Train Roll into Town**

March. They've driven their high energy musical locomotive down 12 original tracks that somehow strike a balance between tradition and anarchy. This powerhouse is headed for the American Legion Cissel Saxon Post 41, 905 Sligo Ave., Silver Spring, MD 20910. Doors open at 6 pm.

The opening act, The Crossfire Band & Show, kicks off the music at 7 pm. The DC-based Crossfire Band received rave reviews for its performance at the DCBS Fourth Friday Blues Happy Hour in April. They give all types of music their own unique touch for a performance that's full of fun, full of soul and full of feeling.

# Scorchin' Hot Blues at DC Blues Festival

It's a good thing the Wunder Garten, site of this year's DC Blues Festival, is an outdoor venue. If the beer garden's owners had a roof, it would have been blown off by the blistering hot music enjoyed on Labor Day.

On one of the hottest days of the summer, all of the bands played scorchin' hot blues that kept the full house crowd dancing and cheering them on for more.

The 29th DC Blues Festival was held Sept. 3 at the Wunder Garten in the NoMa section of Washington, DC. After a one-year hiatus due to ongoing renovation of the Carter Barron Amphitheatre and hearing many requests to put on another festival, DCBS arranged with the Wunder Garten to host this event.

Past festivals were partially financed by a grant from the District government, but this year — without a grant or any advertising money — DCBS fully funded this event and kept admission free for attendees.

The Wunder Garten was a perfect spot for a music festival. A large tent area seated about 400 people who enjoyed the music, and many canopy-covered spots with picnic tables and couches provided places for people to relax, hear the music, drink great beer and enjoy food from two food trucks. While the Wunder Garten is not as large a venue as

the Carter Barron, some attendees commented that they loved its more intimate setting.

The festival featured outstanding music all day long with four great bands. Three of the bands were previous winners of the DCBS Battle of the Bands or Solo/Duo competition: Rogue Johnsen debuting his new big band, New Blues Soul, Fast Eddie & The Slowpokes, and The Patty Reese Band have represented the DC Blues Society at the International Blues Challenge (IBC) in Memphis. TN.

Headliner was the local legend Memphis Gold and special guest Charlie Sayles who closed out the Festival with a huge

crowd of happy dancers in front of the stage. Memphis declined to play a second encore because the heat overwhelmed Sayles who left the stage. We're glad to report he was okay after some cool water and a few minutes to recuperate.




