
Non-stop Blues ...and Smiles

It was the contagious joy of the Blues.


Lil' Ed and the Blues Imperials tore up the Silver Spring American Legion last month with a high energy show that reflected their decades-long love affair with the Blues. Feeding off the band's energy, Blues fans responded by dancin', swayin', movin' and groovin' to the music -- and smilin'.

Touring to promote their latest CD, The Big Sound of Lil' Ed and the Blues Imperials, the band presented an impressive mix of traditional

Garrett on rhythm guitar, James "Pookie" Young on bass, and Kelly Littleton on drums. The foursome has been together for 30+ years, but their showmanship never appeared contrived or stale. This is a group of rock-solid, hard-hitting

musicians who genuinely enjoys playing the Blues for their fans, night after night, gig after gig. The DCBS audience was quick and very vocal in its appreciation for their efforts.

Moving seamlessly from song to song, Lil' Ed's soulful vocals, slide work and string-bending guitar kept the band on its toes and the audience on the dance floor. From the latest CD, "Giving Up on Your Love" and "Green Light Groove" demonstrated the band's tightness and its

Vocalist and local favorite Carly Harvey brought her soulful "A" game to share the spotlight and a huge round of applause. Sol and Carly often appear as a duo, and they represented DCBS at the 2017 International Blues Challenge after winning the 2016 Solo/Duo Competition.

Opening numbers by Sol Roots Trio got the evening off to a rollicking start, presenting an eclectic and diverse selection reflecting the band's unique take on the Blues. As the crowd filtered in, the trio put folks on the right path to a highly enjoyable evening.



Guide to 2018 Local & Nearby Blues Festivals

It's again time to consider which blues festivals you might attend this year. From late Spring through early Fall, many blues and other music festivals are scheduled in the DMV and surrounding states. This annual guide is intended to help DC-area blues fans plan their weekends and trips to include some great festivals that support the Blues. Several festivals are also fundraisers for charities.

As of April 1, plans for the DCBS-sponsored 29th Annual DC Blues Festival are not yet firm. DCBS hopes to have an event on Labor Day or close to that holiday. The Carter Barron Amphitheatre, traditional site of the Annual Festival, is closed for the second year in a row for the National Park Service to address the stage's structural issues. DCBS is presently reviewing options for another venue for the Annual Festival and will announce further plans as soon as they have been determined.

Meet new DCBS Board Member: Adam Oppenheim

Late one night when he was about 14, Adam Oppenheim heard B.B. King's Live at the Cook County Jail played in its entirety on WPFW. It was his Blues epiphany.

When back in DC for breaks during college, Adam got deeper into the local blues scene, catching regular shows at Twist n' Shout and performances of most of the DCBS founders. Adam attended multiple Archie Edwards gigs at Food for Thought and frequented the weekly Grog n' Tankard performances of country blues picker Ben Andrews, who was often joined by folks like Mark Wenner, Eleanor Ellis, Flora Molton, Rick Franklin and Neal Harpe.

During those years, Adam also served as music director of his college radio station, WMHB, and hosted a weekly blues and roots radio program. If you were driving I-95 in Central Maine during the late 1980s and happened to hear Cephas & Wiggins or The Nighthawks on the radio, you likely were tuned into Adam's radio program.

Nearly a decade ago, after mostly woodshedding on guitar over many years, and encouraged by his now wife Nancy, Adam expanded his guitar playing. He began participating in the weekly Piedmont Blues jams hosted by the Archie Edwards Blues Heritage Foundation, as well as the DCBS jams, where he got more deeply involved as a local blues musician and formed friendships with many of the folks he plays with today.

Adam plays lead guitar with DC Mudd and in that role was thrilled to enjoy one of the most wonderful experiences of his life representing the DCBS in Memphis at the 2016 IBC and performing at the 2016 DC Blues Festival.



A D.C. native who has also lived in Colorado and Maine, Adam has recently joined the DCBS Board of Directors. He is a graduate of Colby College in Waterville, Maine and has a law degree from American University, Washington College of Law. Adam worked for several years as an attorney in corporate practice and civil litigation, before joining a local restaurant management company as a business executive, counsel

and part-owner.

After the sale of the company last year, Adam has put up his shingle as a business consultant. Adam looks forward to volunteering his experiences and skills to help the DCBS continue its mission and carry on the local D.C. blues traditions of its founders.


